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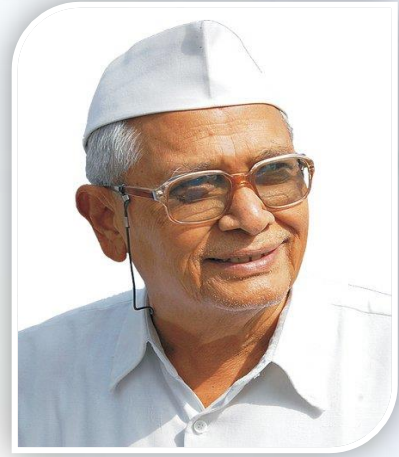

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INTRODUCTION



Dr. Vitthalrao Vikhe Patil Foundation's College of Nursing, Ahilyanagar, is a premier institution dedicated to excellence in nursing education, research, and service. The college is recognized by the Government of Maharashtra and DMER, Maharashtra; approved by the Indian Nursing Council (INC), New Delhi, and Maharashtra Nursing Council (MNC), Mumbai; and affiliated with the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences (MUHS), Nashik, and Maharashtra State Board of Nursing and Paramedical Education (MSBNPE), Mumbai. The institution commenced its journey in 2005 with the General Nursing and Midwifery (GNM) Programme having an intake capacity of 30 students. In response to the growing need for qualified nursing professionals, the college introduced the Basic B.Sc. Nursing Programme in 2008 with an intake capacity of 50 students. The institution continued its expansion by increasing the GNM intake capacity to 80 seats in 2010 and introducing the Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing Programme in the same year with an intake capacity of 30 students. The pursuit of academic excellence further led to the introduction of M.Sc. Nursing Programme in 2017 with an intake capacity of 16 seats in the specialties of Medical-Surgical Nursing, Community Health Nursing, and Mental Health Nursing. In 2022, the institution expanded its postgraduate education by introducing additional specialties in Child Health Nursing and Obstetrics & Gynaecological Nursing, increasing the total postgraduate intake capacity to 26 seats. At present, the M.Sc. Nursing programme offers specialization in Medical-Surgical Nursing (04 seats), Community Health Nursing (04 seats), Mental Health (Psychiatric) Nursing (08 seats), Child Health Nursing (05 seats), and Obstetrics &

Gynaecological Nursing (05 seats). Further strengthening its academic capacity, the college enhanced the intake of Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing to 60 seats and Basic B.Sc. Nursing to 100 seats in 2024.

The college is situated within the sprawling campus of Dr. Vithalrao Vikhe Patil Foundation and is equipped with modern infrastructure, well-established laboratories, advanced teaching-learning resources, and a well-stocked library to support academic excellence and research activities. The institution was founded with the vision of promoting rural upliftment through quality healthcare education, inspired by the ideals of Loknete Dr. Balasaheb Vikhe Patil, (Padma Bhushan Awardee), who strongly believed that the progress of society is closely linked to the advancement of healthcare services. Nestled amidst the scenic hills of the Ghats of Vilad in the rural region of Ahilyanagar District, the campus offers a unique blend of natural beauty and modern infrastructure. Designed to support quality nursing education and holistic student development, the campus reflects a learner-centered, technology-enabled, and environmentally sustainable educational ecosystem. Surrounded by lush greenery and blessed with fresh, pollution-free air, the serene environment creates an ideal atmosphere for learning, research, and clinical practice. The peaceful surroundings are also highly beneficial for the recovery and well-being of patients receiving care in the associated healthcare facilities.

The campus is well-equipped with modern academic, clinical, residential, recreational, and support facilities to cater to the day-to-day needs of students, faculty, staff, patients, and visitors. Its thoughtfully planned infrastructure ensures comfort, convenience, safety, and a nurturing environment that promotes excellence in education, healthcare, and professional growth.

The College Buildings:

The college of nursing has its separate two-storey building constructed as per the norms of governing agency. There are 11 lecture halls with ICT facilities. 6 well-equipped clinical laboratories are available for students' clinical practice. The college has a library with a sufficient number of books and infrastructure. The auditorium, with 500 capacities, enables the execution of cultural & academic programs. On the ground floor, college administration blocks are placed.

The Hostels:

Dr. Vithalrao Vikhe Patil Foundation's College of Nursing, Ahilyanagar, places strong emphasis on providing a safe, disciplined, and supportive residential environment for its undergraduate and postgraduate students. The institution offers well-planned hostel facilities within the secure and serene campus, ensuring a home-away-from-home atmosphere that promotes academic excellence, personal growth, and overall well-being. Students from diverse cultural, linguistic, and regional backgrounds reside together in an environment that fosters mutual respect, harmony, inclusiveness, and holistic development. The hostels are administered by the Hostel Section, which serves as the central administrative unit responsible for the effective management of accommodation facilities, student welfare, maintenance of amenities, mess services, cleanliness, and discipline. Hostel operations are conducted in accordance with institutional policies and

applicable regulatory norms to ensure the safety, comfort, and welfare of all residents. The institution provides separate hostel facilities for boys and girls, with adequate accommodation to meet student requirements. Hostel rooms are well-furnished with essential amenities such as beds, study tables, chairs, cupboards, fans, and lighting fixtures. Accommodation is available on a double- and triple-sharing basis, with attached or common washroom facilities maintained to high standards of cleanliness and hygiene. Each hostel is equipped with modern infrastructure and essential facilities, including solar water heating systems, uninterrupted water and electricity supply, R.O.-purified drinking water with water coolers, reading rooms, recreation rooms, first-aid facilities, newspapers, and telephone services. High-speed internet and ICT facilities support students in their academic and research activities.

Common facilities such as television rooms, indoor games, recreation areas, and dedicated study spaces encourage relaxation, social interaction, and balanced student life. Hostel messes provide nutritious and hygienically prepared meals, including breakfast, lunch, dinner, and refreshments, with strict quality control measures ensuring food safety and hygiene. The safety and security of residents remain a top priority. Each hostel is supervised by a dedicated Resident Warden and a Faculty Rector, who provide continuous guidance, supervision, and support to students. The hostels are further supported by 24×7 security personnel, CCTV surveillance in common areas, and robust monitoring systems to maintain a secure and disciplined environment. To ensure student welfare and address concerns effectively, the institution has established mechanisms such as Anti-Ragging Committees, Hostel Advisory Committees, and Student Support Systems. Additional facilities, including laundry services, visitor management, and maintenance support services, contribute to the convenience and comfort of hostel residents.

Staff Quarters:

Even though rural students get admission to various courses at the University, they need help to afford other facilities. This scheme was formulated as a solution to all these problems and is a revolutionary step in that direction.

3. The Practice:

It is imperative to cater to the educational needs of this region's underprivileged and financially marginalized students. Every year earn and learn circular is displayed, interested candidate apply and the committee short lists the eligible student. The Principal approves the list and submits it to the University. Office work allotted includes library works or any administrative work. Each student is expected to work two hours daily, i.e., 12 hours per week, without affecting their academics. Students working under this scheme are paid Rs.50 per hour, subject to a maximum of Rs. 2000 / month.

Another scheme introduced by the management is open to all students who have been admitted to our institution. Our parent hospital provides the opportunity for them to work in clinical after academic hours, i.e., from 6.00 pm to 12.00 am and pays about 13,000-16,000 / month. The students are posted in different clinical areas without affecting their academics. The majority of students who are seeking higher education are from weaker socioeconomic backgrounds and cannot afford the cost of education. The students expressed that though this scheme is helpful to them but they are unable to enjoy the recreational life.

4. Evidence of Success:

This scheme proves to be a boon for economically weaker students. A good number of beneficiaries of this scheme are leading successful life in every way. Other than that it provides:

- Better option is to prevent eligible students from not pursuing the course for the reason of financial crisis.
- Students get additional experience in office, clinical and fieldwork.

- Students are also absorbed in the parent institute after passing out.
- By different areas of experience, the students easily got selected in competitive exams.

5. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

In the case of U.G. Students, only limited number of students can be benefitted from this scheme. It is difficult to provide work for each student as per their choices. Students have to work after college hours, so we are facing difficulty in managing the manpower for their supervision. Students will be engage in non-academic hours and it is difficult for them to participate in co-curricular activities.

B] Solar Plant

1. Objectives:

- I. To provide uninterrupted and economical electricity in the campus.
- II. To encourage a healthy and eco-friendly environment in and around the institute.
- III. To look out for the future of our planet and reduce the impact of fossil fuels by reducing carbon dioxide emissions.

2. The Context:

Institutions makes huge expenses to provide electricity for its infrastructures. Due to load shedding and interruption in electricity, the institute has to utilize alternative sources which lead to environmental pollution. The ever-renewable source of energy from the sun is a boon for mankind. Our Institution consumes 60,000 units of electricity, costing about 8-9 lakh per month. To minimize the expenses, avail uninterrupted electricity and maintain an eco-friendly campus, the institute installed a solar plant.

3. The Practice:

The institute installed 500 kWp solar plants on 22nd October 2021 by Deserve –Renew Sys Company. After installation, it started functioning from 1st November 2021. The cost of installing a solar plant was around 3.50 Crores. 200 panels which cover about 60 hectares were installed on a sloped area in the north-south direction as the sunlight will be flashing the whole day (8-10 hrs) throughout the panel and can generate energy. Solar-generated energy is supplied to our Nursing College and campus. The main street lights and many semi-integrated street lights function from our solar energy.

One of the advantage is that due to continuous current supply of express feeder type, there is no load shedding , it acts as a green energy power plant. The conventional non-renewable energies cause air pollution and solar energy doesn't, so it is as good as planting a tree. This solar power plant provides us with an eco-friendly atmosphere and is part of our green initiative. The solar energy produced in excess is exported to MSEB and imported from them when the production is less, so the balance can be maintained the whole year.

4. Evidence of Success:

Now the Institutions can meet energy demands without paying high electricity bill costs. It can be seen that saving to the tune of Rs. 25, 99,344 has happened in just one year. The difference between solar energy and conventional electricity is that solar energy does not rely on the use of fossil fuels, does not pollute air or water, and does not contribute to global warming, making it the preferable option. Moreover, solar energy works with the earth's natural resources, whereas conventional electricity depletes or harms them by causing air pollution, so it's a part of green energy.

5. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

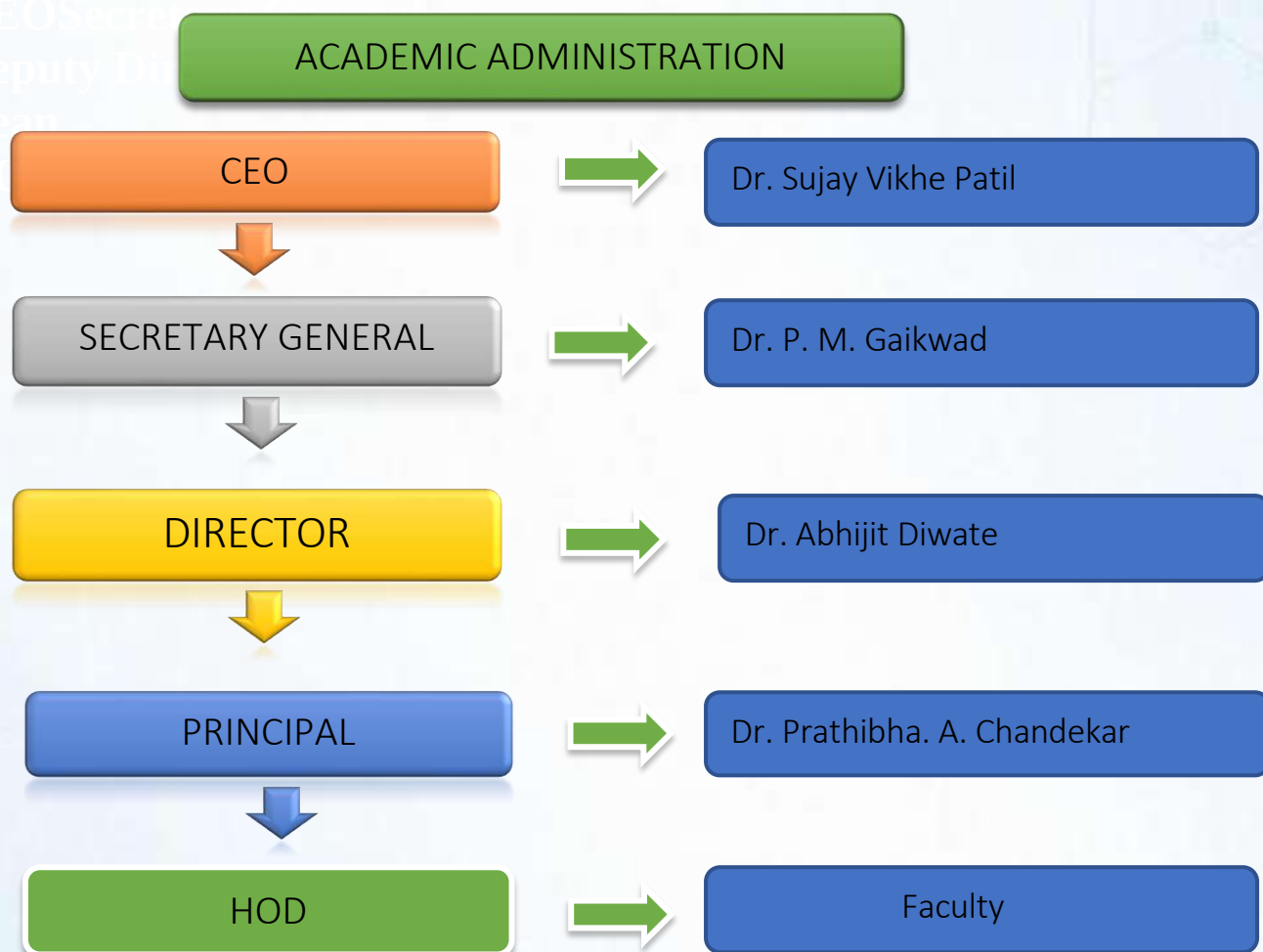
The institute has invested a heavy amount of 3.5 Crores for 500 kWp capacity plant, but the excess electricity which is produced during the summer season cannot be stored. For the storage of surplus electricity, lithium-ion- batteries are required, which cost a high amount. Due to unavailability/interrupted sunlight at night and during the rainy season, we have to depend on the MSEB accordingly. A large area is permanently occupied.

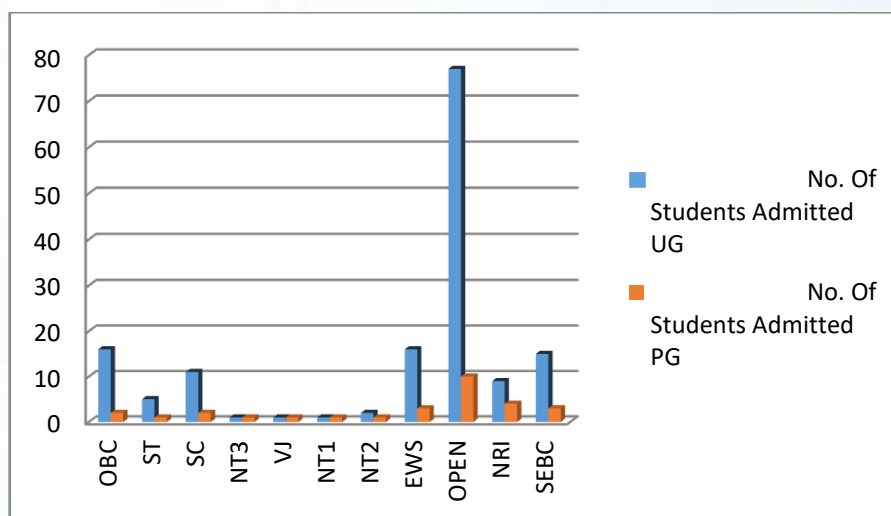

RESEARCH

The Code of Ethics for Research Practice has been developed in alignment with national and international ethical guidelines, institutional policies, and the requirements of research funding agencies. It promotes honesty, transparency, objectivity, responsible data management, proper authorship, avoidance of plagiarism, and responsible publication practices.

THE HOSPITAL



The Teaching Hospital is an integral part of the medical college campus and serves as the primary clinical training center for undergraduate and postgraduate nursing and medical students. Spread over a built-up area of 55,432.01 sq. metres within a 25-acre campus at the serene Vilad Ghat, the hospital has evolved into more than 800-bedded tertiary care teaching hospital, established in March 2000 in accordance with the norms prescribed by the Medical Council of India (now National Medical Commission).

The hospital provides comprehensive, patient-centered healthcare services to both rural and urban populations while offering extensive clinical learning opportunities for nursing students. With well-organized Outpatient Departments (OPDs), Inpatient Departments (IPDs), Emergency and Trauma Services, Intensive Care Units (ICUs), Modern Operation Theatre Complexes, and Super-Specialty Services, students gain hands-on experience in diverse clinical settings under the guidance of experienced healthcare professionals.

The hospital offers multidisciplinary healthcare services through the Departments of General Medicine, General Surgery, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Paediatrics, Orthopaedics, Ophthalmology, Otorhinolaryngology (ENT), Dermatology, Psychiatry, Dentistry, Tuberculosis & Chest Diseases, Anaesthesiology, and Physiotherapy. Super-specialty services include Cardiology, Neurology, Nephrology, Oncology, Urology, Gastroenterology, and Neurosurgery, ensuring advanced patient care and enriched clinical exposure for nursing students.

Advanced diagnostic and support services include a Central Clinical Laboratory providing biochemical, pathological, histopathological, microbiological, and other diagnostic investigations. The laboratory has achieved 24th rank in the External Quality Assessment Scheme conducted by Christian

Medical College (CMC), Vellore, reflecting its commitment to quality standards. The Department of Radiodiagnosis is equipped with Ultrasonography, Colour Doppler, Digital X-ray, CT Scan, MRI, Mammography, and other advanced imaging facilities. The hospital also houses an FDA-approved Blood Bank with a modern Blood Component Laboratory and a fully functional Medical Store to ensure uninterrupted patient care.

Critical care services are provided through well-equipped Medical and Surgical Intensive Care Units (ICUs) featuring ventilators, central cardiac monitoring systems, pulse oximeters, central oxygen supply, and suction facilities. Dedicated Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) and Paediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU) provide specialized care for critically ill newborns and children. A modern Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory (Cath Lab) offers advanced cardiac interventions including angiography and angioplasty.

The hospital actively extends healthcare services beyond the campus through its Urban Health Centre, Rural Health Training Centre, Mobile Medical Unit, and regular Multi-Diagnostic Health Camps conducted in surrounding villages. These outreach activities provide nursing students with valuable community health nursing experience while promoting preventive, promotive, curative, and rehabilitative healthcare services.

The Teaching Hospital remains committed to delivering high-quality, affordable, and accessible healthcare while serving as an excellent clinical learning environment. Its comprehensive healthcare infrastructure, advanced medical technology, experienced multidisciplinary team, and strong community outreach programs significantly contribute to the professional development and clinical competency of nursing students, preparing them to provide evidence-based, compassionate, and holistic patient care.

Dr. Vithalrao Vikhe Patil Foundation's College of Nursing, Ahilyanagar, established in 2005, has emerged as one of the leading nursing institutions in Maharashtra.
